rom her very first visit to White Ridge Farm at Elimbah when she was 12, Bailey McGrath didn't want to leave. Now, she doesn't have to and gets to spend every day working amongst the fur, feathers and flurry of activity White Ridge Farm has to offer.

"I work full-time at White Ridge Farm, five days a week," Bailey said. "Although I love it so much, sometimes I'm there even when I'm not working so I can hang out with the animals!"

Initially starting in a volunteering role before having to move away with family, Bailey missed the farm and couldn't wait to get back there when she returned. She is now a team leader and helps with animal husbandry, as well as being actively involved with visitors.

All up, Bailey has now been working at the farm for about five years, but still fondly recalls that first visit like it was yesterday.

"The one thing I remember the most was watching one of the workers bottle-feeding a calf and I really wanted to have a turn," she said. "I stood in front of them the entire time.

hoping she would let me help! After this visit, I knew I would love doing that kind of job and just being surrounded by the animals made me so happy."

With nine animals at home and plenty more at work, Bailey is never without company, but picking a favourite isn't easy. If she had to choose, it would be between Amy the sheep, who was rejected by her mother and Charlie the donkey, who lost his mother when he was just one month old.

"Amy wasn't the healthiest little lamb and we had ups and downs but eventually she got over her illness with medication and A LOT of love," Bailey said. "Seeing her all big and strong there never ceases to make me happy knowing that she made it – she'll always be my baby.

"I spent a lot of time with Charlie and although he can be challenging at times (and a little naughty) his cheeky personality never fails to make me laugh or put a smile on my face. I particularly love our cuddles!"

Her strong bond with animals and the team at White Ridge are big parts of why Bailey loves going to work.

"Working at White Ridge Farm I've learned that no two animals are the same," she said. "Each and every animal has their own very unique personality and so you can't treat them all the same either.

"Animals are just so truly incredible and intelligent, the bonds you form with them are something to cherish forever.

"Thank you Katrina and David White for allowing me the opportunity to work with you here at White Ridge Farm and allowing me to grow into who I am today."



main oval, with monster trucks and fireworks some of the big attractions.

Caboolture Show Society secretary David Burrus compiled a history of the show some time ago, highlighting the many facets that have seen our local show grow to what it is today.

The Caboolture Show is one steeped in history and goes back more than 100 years! The show society formed on 1 May 1914 and ran until 1941 when it stopped due to World War II and the showgrounds were used for the military before the show resumed again in 1956.

- The first show was held in 1914 on what would now be classed as a bushland clearing but was considered a success. for its time.
- The 50th Golden Jubilee show was held 3-5 June 1977 and has been continuous since then.
- Miss Caboolture and Mrs Caboolture balls were organised from 1962 until early 2005.

• In 1968, Danny Castle was asked by Alex Barr, the shire chairman of the time, to run the wood-chopping events at the showgrounds.

• The indoor arena was built in 1989 along with the Alf and Dulcie Gamgee Pavilion.

A BOOMING HUB OF ACTIVITY

ith the inclusion of a 150-place childcare centre, a swim school and 80 residential lots in the mix, a new development is certainly making waves in the suburb of Morayfield.

Morayfield Marketplace construction is already underway on Oakey Flat Road and is expected to open in early 2025. Local developer Adpen is behind the project, which is forecast to create about 400 construction jobs and 60 permanent jobs.

The man behind the project is local developer Adam Pennisi. With his own young family at the forefront of his mind, Mr Pennisi saw the potential to make a difference in the community in an area that would greatly assist local families.

"The decision to build a childcare, swim school and 80 residential lots was all about meeting the real needs of the local community," Mr Pennisi said. "Morayfield is growing fast and we noticed a significant shortage of childcare options for families here. Adpen carefully studied the area's needs through an Economics Needs Assessment, which highlighted this demand.

"Our goal is to make a positive impact on the lives of local families by providing essential services that truly enhance their quality of life. We are excited to be part of this community's growth and to contribute to its future in a meaningful way."

The development project aligns with the anticipated growth of the Moreton Bay area, which is projected to reach a population of 800,000 residents by 2046. By investing in childcare infrastructure and supporting the recruitment and development of childcare workers, Adpen is working on an aim to support a thriving community while providing essential services to local families.

"By building a state-of-the-art, 150-place childcare and swim school, we're creating safe and nurturing places that cater directly to the families who call this area home," Mr Pennisi said. "As a father to young children myself, I want to create environments that foster learning, development and build strong foundations for the next generation. It's more than just building homes, it's about helping build a community that supports the needs of the residents living there."



Karen Goullet and husband Jamie are the human component in this furry story. They are the compassionate and forever caring faces behind the Sanctuary for Senior Dogs Brisbane

right here in the City of Moreton Bay. Now running for 18 years and initially starting on a smaller block in Burpengary, the sanctuary has been at its Morayfield location since 2016.

Although they have helped so many dogs in that time, Karen and Jamie are still trying to get the message out there that old dogs are amazing and for people to think about adopting them or fostering them.

"Puppies are wonderful, but old dogs are very very special and it's a very special bonding time when you love and care for an old dog that has limited time left," Karen said.

Quite often the sanctuary is contacted by family members of those going into aged care, looking for someone to take their beloved older pooches. But Karen points out there are options available to them.

"I'm trying to get the message out there for people to make those arrangements for their dogs before they do go into care because there's programs out there like the Animal Welfare League that can help you with that sort of thing and not many people know about it," Karen said.

To hear what some of these dogs have been through is enough to bring tears to anyone's eyes. But as Karen admits, you can't focus on the bad side, you have to put all your energy into making a better life for the dogs.

"We don't focus on how much time they've got left," she said. "We focus on giving them a good time while they're here.

"It's about giving them a home. It's about helping them and getting the care they need to live out their lives in a happy, healthy, loved environment. So, my whole day is just full of washing, cleaning, grooming, playing, looking after the seniors and cooking – it's busy but very fulfilling."

A steering committee has been formed, comprising Council, business and community interests.

One of the driving forces behind this exciting new initiative, Councillor Adam Hain, said the fresh brand for Caboolture came from a need to eradicate the historical negative stigma and replace it with 100% positivity.

"Statistics such as crime rate are far less than places such as Broadbeach on the Gold Coast, and Greater Caboolture's positive stories far outweigh the negative," Adam said.

"With unprecedented investment into Caboolture alongside Council's Revitalisation Plan, now is the opportunity to celebrate the real news on this area."

Other committee members agree that now is the

CABOOLTURE'S STORY: A BRIEF WALK THROUGH HISTORY

aboolture's tale begins in 1842 when the fertile lands around Moreton Bay beckoned settlers seeking new opportunities. The Indigenous landowners referred to the region surrounding the Caboolture River as Kabul-tur, signifying

"the place of the carpet snakes" due to the abundant presence of these reptiles in the area.

The Caboolture River emerged as a lifeline, facilitating trade and transportation. Timber getters floated red cedar logs downstream, while settlers relied on the river to ferry in their supplies, laying the foundation for a flourishing community.

By the 1860s, agriculture took centre stage, with local farmers venturing into sugarcane and cotton cultivation. Settlement in Caboolture gained momentum following the discovery of gold in Gympie, and by 1868, the town had become an essential waypoint for the Cobb and Co coach service, linking Brisbane, Gympie, and Maryborough.

Caboolture witnessed a series of milestones with the opening of a post office, providing

a vital link to the outside world, while the founding of the first state school in 1873 laid the groundwork for education in the region. This period marked a turning point, leading to the establishment of the local shire in 1879 and the inauguration of a railway line from Brisbane in 1888.

In an area where religious figures held significant sway, the cornerstone of St Laurence's Anglican Church was placed on Saturday, 26 January 26 1889 by Mrs WG Geddes. This pivotal moment unfolded in a ceremony led by Canon Glennie and Archdeacon Matthews. Mr WG Geddes, esteemed among Caboolture's earliest settlers, generously contributed the land for the church's establishment. Following its consecration in 1959, the church underwent extensive reconstruction and was rededicated in 1982.

As time marched on, Caboolture continued to evolve, shaped by the resilience and determination of its residents. Today, echoes of its past resonate throughout the town, from the historic landmarks to the bustling markets. Every street corner in Caboolture holds a piece of its history, weaving together its rich heritage.

As Caboolture strides forward into the future, it upholds its heritage with pride, embodying the enduring spirit of community. Within its urban landscape, the echoes of its founding pioneers resonate, underscoring its transformation from a humble settlement to a thriving modern metropolis.



URGENT CALL FOR **CABOOLTURE MUMS: DONATIONS NEEDED TO ADDRESS BREAST MILK SHORTAGE**

Caboolture Hospital, along with other hospitals across Queensland, is facing a critical shortage of donated breast milk, prompting an urgent appeal from Australian Red Cross Lifeblood for more donors to alleviate the shortage.

Recent reports have highlighted that the supply of donated breast milk in Queensland has dwindled to less than two weeks' worth, placing hospitals in Caboolture and neighbouring areas in a dire situation.

Premature and low birth-weight babies rely heavily on breast milk for their growth and development, making this shortage particularly alarming for their well-being. While no babies are currently going without, efforts are underway to redistribute milk to ensure hospitals receive an adequate supply.

Residents of Caboolture who are able to

donate breast milk are urged to contribute more than three litres of frozen or expressed milk, which should be less than 10 weeks old. Eligibility criteria and registration procedures can be found on the Lifeblood website.



early 20 years ago, a young couple Tina Fullerton and Warwick Hargreaves teamed up and created a musical duo. They called themselves Out of Abingdon after the Woolloongabba street they had lived in before settling in Redcliffe. For the next five years, they called the Peninsula home, and they entertained a growing number of fans, principally at coffee houses in Scarborough Village. Their unique musical style, which covered jazz, folk, blues and groove genres played by songstress Tina on the double bass coupled with Warwick's guitar accompaniment assured their continued popularity.

But they soon attracted interest from Brisbane and settled there, where they continued to add to their massive fan base. In turn, the rest of Australia beckoned and in a specially built 'home truck' they travelled the country, performing in cafes and festivals, predominantly in New South Wales and Victoria. Averaging 100 performances a year, this dynamic twosome kept their audiences enthralled.

Interest from overseas saw the duo tour Europe no less than four times, playing at major venues in London, Edinburgh, Paris and Berlin. By this time, they had released three albums of their songs and created their fourth in India, where they were accompanied by noted Indian musicians.

Their latest album Red Dirt Tracks forms the basis of the musical two-performance program they presented at Redcliffe's The Loft in December last year. antiques are seriously blokey collectables. You are likely to see these collectables in man caves or simply throughout one's home. The biggest category I have found, and the most popular, is the alcohol category. I think it is because there is usually a bar in most man caves. I can't buy enough old enamel alcohol signs, beer barrels, branded jugs, decanters, corkscrews and ashtrays. The next best category is nautical. I fall into this category as I live on the waterfront in Clontarf. Hand-blown glass fishing floats manufactured in Japan seem to be the most popular and ship bells, propellers, barometers, portholes and diving helmets are a close second.

Militaria is popular amongst collectors as it has a huge range of collectables from all wars. First is all the clothing and armour such as uniforms, hats, helmets and holsters. Then there are weapons such as knives, bayonets, swords and guns. Medals from all the wars are very sought after as are army badges. Over the years, I have bought and sold a number of trench art pieces which were made by soldiers out of shell casings – these were mainly ashtrays.

Sporting collectables are also found in many man caves – fishing reels and cricket bats, wooden surfboards, wooden lawn bowls and wooden rowing oars. If it's made from wood I can sell it, if it's plastic I can't. It is the same with old tools; they have to be made from wood and steel. Tools such as planes, chisels, saws, drills, spirit levels, hammers, axes etc.

My favourite collection is the metalware. These collectors will spend hours cleaning an old copper kettle or candlesticks. So many household items were made from metal – from old tins to toys. Most old farm equipment such as water pumps, milk cans, camp ovens, buckets, shears and butter churns are all made from metal.

ylie and Kent Payne, founders of the Harrison Payne Initiative, have been inspiring Aussies to save lives on and off the road since their son. Harry, was killed in a 4WD crash in 2021.

This month, to honour their son and to raise funds to support victims of road and beach trauma, the 4th annual Deadlift Day for Harry will be held at World Gym Burpengary.

Kylie said the not-for-profit was all about 'strength to change' and creating conversations about beach, 4WD and road safety.

"Everyone needs to feel safe on and off the road," Kylie said. "That's what we are trying to get across to people. You have to think of the people inside and outside of your vehicle."

Harry had just turned 18 when he died in a beach crash on Bribie Island. A graduate of St Eugene College, he loved to train deadlifts at World Gym Burpengary.

The Deadlift for Harry event on 8 June will feature a deadlift competition and free activities including an animal farm and face-painting, alongside stalls from local businesses. One highlight will be local candlemaker Bec from Hope Aromas, who created Harry's memorial candles.

In addition to the annual event, the Harrison Payne Initiative is also funding 10 young people to help them gain their driver's licenses.

Kylie said with the support of a grant from City of Moreton Bay, the initiative would assist five young people in the area while funding the other five themselves.

"With times the way they are at the moment, it's hard to pay for driving lessons," she said. "They might be taught by someone who is not a professional -- and road rules have changed -- so we need to make sure these kids are getting the right support and the right teachings.

"Harry has come from a family who were able to

support him. His parents were able to pay for his driving lessons. There are kids out there who don't have that opportunity and we want to support those kids in that journey in gaining their license."

Kylie also encouraged everyone to visit the Harrison Payne Initiative website to purchase a 'HKP03 Harrison's Number Plate' sticker, which serves as a conversation starter to tell Harry's story and discuss the importance of speaking up in unsafe situations.

WINTER ON THE BAY

hank goodness it's winter! The winds are starting to drop off and turn southwesterly and eventually westerly. These offshore winds deliver better water clarity and reduce water temperature in the bay which brings the spawning run of bream, tarwhine and snapper. Offshore winds are also the best option to cross the bay to fish the outer reefs for reef fish. If your boat has been sitting for a while, you might want to put a bottle of octane boost to mix in with your old fuel. Check life jackets, v sheets and the date on your flares - you don't want to get fined and sent back to the boat ramp. Use large chunks of mullet flesh on 4/0 as the big baited hooks catch the biggest reef fish.



Bream are now starting to school at the Scarborough reef peg. To avoid snags run a 0-ball sinker on top of a 1/0 hook or a 2/0 hook which is completely covered in prawn. Please do not use green prawns imported from Asian countries sold at the supermarket. These prawns are for cooking and eating and may contain white spot - they cannot be used for bait.

The winter whiting are also turning up in numbers off Bribie Island or the Cockle Banks and just outside the green zone off Godwin Beach at Beachmere. It's best to fish in the three metres. of water on the drift and the best bait is either worms or small strips of squid. I use a number 6 long shank hook to release the small whiting. Even though there is no size limit on these winter or diver whiting, I only keep them if they are over 22cm. Remember there is a bag limit of 50.

There are also a lot of bait balls getting around Moreton Bay. Check out the four sharks feeding on the shoreline at Combie Point (pictured). The next day my two sons and I had a lot of fun casting out lures at the back of these bait balls and got a few good tailor and I landed a 68cm flathead (pictured).

Stay warm and safe out on the water.


