Northside Soul Sisters will be performing their annual showcase Ritz to Rock – a musical time capsule, featuring songs from the last 100 years of music.

As an added bonus to the afternoon of entertainment, 50% of all ticket sales (tickets are \$5) will go to Caboolture Community Action, a group that offers practical outreach, support and encouragement to people in the local area who are experiencing extreme hardship, homelessness or are at risk of homelessness.

Amanda Sutter is the president of Northside Soul Sisters, a group she credits with bringing her out of her musical shell.

"I have been able to sing all my life; however, I never had the confidence to sing anywhere other than my car or shower," Amanda said. "I really wanted to put myself out of my comfort zone and pushed myself at the first meet-up of choir, to attend. I went from not singing in public to doing solos in the choir and doing karaoke most weekends. I believe choir solidified my passion for singing and music and the encouragement of the group has given me that confidence."

Northside Soul Sisters have been together for threeand-a-half years with the idea originally generated from a women's group that a few ladies were part of and someone wanted to put together a choir. A small group formed a choir, and Priyanka Hemmadi offered to take the lead, a role she still holds today. "The group means the world to me and so many of our members," Amanda said. "It is a place where women of all ages, backgrounds, interests and circumstances can come together and share their love of music."

Those who come along to the show can expect a journey of songs that have shaped 100 years of music.

"We are singing one song from each decade from the 1920's to 2020's and one original song, which the whole choir had a hand in lyric writing, but has been composed and arranged by Priyanka," Amanda said. "There will be slow ballads and upbeat songs that will have the audience remembering where they were when that song was playing, or what helped shape the music they listen to today. In between the choir numbers, the audience will be treated to duets and small group numbers from our choir that have chosen to challenge themselves with songs they love.

"By coming to our show you will be supporting an amazing group of women who just love choir and singing. We are so lucky to be supported by the City of Moreton Bay to bring our showcase to the community."

NO NEED TO BOOK, JUST BRING THE FAMILY TALLOWWOOD DRIVE, DECEPTION BAY



hen it comes to longevity for local community groups, the Rotary Club of Caboolture are certainly showing their strength.

This year, the club is celebrating 70 years and will be having an anniversary dinner at the North Lakes Hotel on 2 August.

Kathleen Finter joined the Rotary Club of Caboolture just over three years ago, fulfilling the role of secretary for most of that time (until 1 July), as well as being a very active member of the community.

"Celebrating 70 years serving our wonderful community is certainly an achievement; our members are very excited about reaching this milestone." Kathleen said. "We have been involved in the Caboolture community on many levels over the years, mainly by identifying a need in the community and then coming up with a solution of some kind."

In the early days, the club was behind the installation

of park benches, picnic tables and bus shelters. They became more adventurous, moving on to bigger projects, such as raising funds for the construction of the Caboolture Swimming Pool in the early 1960s and the development of the Centenary Lakes sporting grounds.

"We constructed the Netball Association kiosk and amenities block and helped

form the BMX track." Kathleen said. "Finally. we sponsored the Rotary Walkway through Centenary Lakes, which we have upgraded several times with new exercise stations.

"We also built a chapel/quiet room at Caboolture Hospital, installed a liberty swing at Riding for the Disabled and sponsored one of their horses 'Lefty' for many years, as well as undertaking many working bees at the centre."

Another big milestone was in 1986, with the Rotary Club of Caboolture assisting to get the local radio station FM101.5 up and running. There has also been a lot of support for the younger members of the community.

"As far back as 1961, we have been sponsoring young people to go to the Rotary Youth Leadership camp," Kathleen said. "We also sponsor year 12 students to attend the National Youth Science Forum.

"We are very much involved in the Rotary Youth Driver Awareness Program that we run out of Morayfield Sports and Entertainment Centre over the years, thousands of local students have attended this training."

On top of many of these programs and projects, one of the group's most ambitious projects is seeing an end to domestic violence.

"For the last four years, we have run Red Ride to raise awareness of domestic violence," Kathleen said. "However, on a national level our current president Eric Wood is working on the 'say no to domestic violence' campaign. To raise awareness of domestic violence, businesses are encouraged to have their employees wear purple shirts on Fridays."

culpting a piece of Australia's cultural heritage in metal was a formidable undertaking for Caboolture-based chainsaw artist and boxing coach Luke Sheehan

In a departure from his usual medium of wood, Luke has created a life-sized mixed-media piece titled. Such is Life.

The metal and wood sculpture depicts legendary Australian bushranger Ned Kelly astride his horse and is attracting national attention as Luke's entry in Outback Sculpture 2024, a competition held annually in Roma that celebrates world-class street art.

Luke said his main goal was to make a horse but that he decided to add the figure of Ned Kelly in his trademark suit of iron.

"Ned Kelly is one of the most iconic figures in Australian history," Luke said.

Caboolture locals agree. Passers-by stopped to take selfies with the finished artwork, as it stood in Luke's front yard awaiting delivery to Roma.

Luke likened his creative process to unravelling different puzzles and putting them together.

"I've never done anything like this before, so it was very challenging," he said. "I had a voice inside saying, 'You can do this,' and another saying, 'No, you can't.'"

Using a minimal toolkit comprising a welder, grinder, multi-grips, mallet and a hammer, Luke experimented with innovative techniques to bend and weld the metal and mix epoxy resin within the wood to ensure it didn't ignite during welding.

Luke said he worked on the artwork every spare minute between his regular jobs as a PT Head Coach at Spiders Gym in Caboolture and a chainsaw carver at weekend shows.

"It's been a journey," he said. "I've missed out on family events and even my own birthday."

His supportive family and friends helped - his daughter as a model for Ned's hands and a friend straddled the back of Luke's couch to simulate a riding posture for the Kelly figure.

To achieve a further degree of realism for the piece, Luke researched Ned's gun, deconstructed leather boots and spent four days perfecting the curvature of the horse's ears. He describes the saddle as a sculpture in its own right. In all, it took him over 460 hours to complete.

Competition winners were announced in Roma on 15 June. Although Luke's Such is Life sculpture missed out on a prize, it is on public display in Roma's Outdoor Walk of Art until 29 September, after which it will be listed for sale.

JUMPING INTO A PLAYGROUND OF NATURE

If you thought the playground at the Caboolture
Region Environment Education Centre (CREEC)
was 'cool' before, you might want to drop by again.

Already proving popular, the new and one-of-akind playground was officially opened by the City of Moreton Bay at the end of June (just in time for school holidays).


The \$1.3 million playground blends nature-themed play with the surrounding environment, educational centre and existing play space.

Lead designers of the playground, SLR Consulting, aimed to create a harmonious relationship between fun, adventure and nature. Featuring climbing ropes, a macadamia nut-inspired play hut, slides, an agility course, a swaying hammock, totem poles, inground trampolines, swings, sand play and water play (which will be very popular once the warmer weather kicks in), there's a diverse range of activities to cover many age groups.

Ensuring easy access for everyone, interconnecting pathways swirl throughout the play space. Sun safety has also been factored in with shade sails

covering the area.

Along with playground equipment supplier Urban Play, senior play consultant Nikita Burns was also involved in the

City of Moreton Bay Mayor Peter Flannery said providing children and families opportunities to get active and learn about the natural wonders around them was a big focus for Council.

"We're fortunate to be surrounded by wildlife, amazing flora and three environment centres, which are all ready to explore," he said. "These spaces provide substantial value to our community and provide visitors with free, educational and most importantly, fun adventures. Accessibility and meaningful play elements were a focus for this project and it was incredible to see families of all ages at the official opening of the playground."

Division 12 councillor Tony Latter said he was proud to see the playground open for all to enjoy.

"CREEC is an outstanding facility, playground and educational centre and I encourage everyone to visit," he said. "I am always excited when we can bring another affordable, fun day out option to our residents and being able to tie in the importance of protecting our environment is an enormous plus."

t all started with a few backpacks filled with the necessities for kids who needed them.

Now two years on, Bright Bags has put together more than 2000 bags (birthday, essential and hygiene) and it's time to celebrate at a birthday morning tea event this month.



Bright Bags (which is operated by Raedel Support Group Inc.) is the brainchild of Kerri Raedel, an idea which came to fruition because all children deserve love, no matter who they are or where they are.

"We service only local organisations and deliver real needs in real time - specific to the child's age, situation and needs," Kerri said. "We do emergency deliveries, scheduled deliveries, birthdays and also work with organisations to have bags ready as they need them."

Celebrating the enormous achievements Bright Bags has reached in the last two years was an easy decision for Kerri.

"I decided to have a celebration because we never get to stop and just celebrate our community as a whole," she said. "This is the perfect chance to all come together, to meet each other - likeminded souls - and for our charity to say thank you, in person.

"I am grateful to every single person that has donated to our cause over the last two years - it has meant that we were able to fill a bag in time and with what the child needed."

The event is free and open to the community, but numbers are capped so tickets need to be locked through the online portal.

Knowing the difference Bright Bags has made to so many lives is what motivates Kerri to keep going and shining a light on children in need at a local level.

"It fills my heart to know that humour and kindness is still present in a troubled world," Kerri said. "At

times we can be very disillusioned at events happening around us, but operating this organisation without grants or government assistance has shown me that our local community is truly making a difference.

"Bright Bags would not have been possible without my dedicated and hardworking team, who spend their own time and money and have the same focus as I do - that we need to help our own local children in real time and ensure the community come along for the journey."

As we head towards the end of the year Bright Bags will be gearing up for their 2024 Christmas Appeal. More information will be available in September.

The group always welcomes donations from the community for children up to the age of 17. They are also in need of more drop-off points in Redcliffe and Strathpine. All the details are on their Facebook page - Bright Bags QLD.

MORAYFIELD

TO BENEFIT FROM \$7 MILLION ROAD UPGRADE

he Queensland Government has committed \$7 million to ease congestion on Buchanan Road in Morayfield as part of the new \$100 million Local Congestion Busting Program.

The funding is in addition to a \$7 million commitment from City of Moreton Bay and will be used for planning work aimed at improving the road network to decrease delays and increase reliability.

The upgrade will focus on areas where congestion is most severe and will provide the greatest improvements.

Minister for Transport and Main Roads, Bart Mellish, said the Local Congestion fund would improve bottlenecks to make a real difference in people's lives by reducing the time wasted in traffic.

"This section of Buchanan Road and William Berry Drive – between Morayfield Road and the Bruce Highway – is a key route through the region and considered vital to accommodate the region's projected growth over the coming years," Mr Mellish said.

"We know that transport is critically important in allowing people to get on with their lives – be it working in the city, dropping the kids at school, getting to and from medical appointments or making deliveries."

Member for Morayfield, Mark Ryan, said the project would provide ongoing benefits for years to come.

"This is all about delivering for local communities," he said. "Delivering enhanced transport infrastructure makes a very real difference in the everyday lives of the people in this community."

"It will also improve east-west connectivity to alleviate traffic congestion on the Bruce Highway," Mayor Flannery said.

"I am pleased that the State has acknowledged the significance of this critical road corridor and Council looks forward to working closely with the State to make this happen.

"The Buchanan Road upgrade is a project that will truly benefit our residents now and into the future."

LIFESAVING ADDITION: DEFIBRILLATOR NOW LOCATED IN WALLACE STREET PARK

City of Moreton Bay has installed nine Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) in selected parks to enhance community safety and to increase the survival chances for individuals experiencing cardiac arrest. Each defibrillator has been strategically installed at a location with consideration to the surrounding demographics' age, health considerations and distance to a hospital. These AEDs provide clear visual and voice instructions to guide users through the resuscitation process until professional help arrives. This initiative is part of a pilot program that may expand to more parks with high visitation rates. Be sure to keep an eye out for this life-saving device! One AED is now available at Wallace Street Park in Caboolture.





nity. Starting 2 December 2024, eligible households will receive a 240-litre garden organics (GO) bin with a lime green lid.

This initiative is designed to divert 15,000 tonnes of organic material from landfill each year, significantly reducing our greenhouse gas emissions and supporting our goal of achieving net zero emissions by 2039.

The new GO bins will be distributed to approximately 116,000 households, making it one of the largest bin rollouts in Australia.

Residents with properties between 300 and 2,000 square metres will automatically receive a GO bin.

For those with smaller or larger properties, you can opt-in to the service starting 1 March 2025.

The bins will be emptied fortnightly, on the same day as your general waste bin, but on alternate weeks to your recycling bin.

You can use your GO bin for tree branches, leaves, grass clippings and other garden trimmings. However, please avoid placing plastic, general waste, food scraps, or any non-organic materials in these bins to ensure the quality of the mulch produced.

Together, we can make a significant impact on our environment. Let's embrace this new service and work towards a greener, cleaner Moreton Bay.





eorge Raff, a notable figure in Queensland's agricultural and political history, established the Morayfield farm, marking an era of significant agricultural experimentation and development.

Born in Scotland in 1815, Raff's journey from Scotland to Australia began in 1839 when he arrived in Sydney. His ventures led him to Brisbane in 1851, where he soon founded George Raff & Co and the Queensland Mercantile and Agency Co, significantly contributing to the direct wool trade between Brisbane and London.

In 1861, Raff began cultivating cotton on his property in Morayfield, which sprawled across 2,500 acres along the Caboolture River. However, the cotton venture proved unsuccessful, prompting Raff to shift his focus to sugar. By 1866, the Morayfield Plantation was established on the southern bank of the Caboolture River where he grew sugar cane for sugar, rum and molasses production until 1889.

Morayfield Plantation was a self-sufficient estate with a grand mansion, manager's house, labourers' huts, stockyards, stables, sheds, carpenters' and blacksmith's shops, and even a distillery for rum production.

Raff's innovative approach included connecting the plantation by rail to his own wharf on the river, facilitating efficient transport of goods.

Raff's contributions extended beyond agriculture. He played a pivotal role in the political landscape of Queensland. In 1859, he represented Brisbane in the first Queensland Parliament and became the first Chairman of the Caboolture Divisional Board in 1880. His influence was felt in the establishment of the Queensland Steam Navigation Co and his direct involvement in the wool trade.

Despite his many achievements, Raff faced challenges. Sugar cane cultivation ceased around 1885-86, and Raff passed away on 28 August 1889. He was buried in Toowong Cemetery. In 1901, the plantation was sold and converted to dairy farming, marking the end of an era for Morayfield Plantation.

Raff's legacy, however, is etched in history. His agricultural innovation and political service efforts have left an indelible mark on Queensland. Today, the story of George Raff and Morayfield serves as a testament to the pioneering spirit that shaped the region.

BUILDING GETS UNDERWAY FOR NEW CABOOLTURE PCYC



he local community is one step closer to enjoying the new Caboolture Police Citizens Youth Club (PCYC) with building work kicking off in late June.

The new PCYC facility will proudly sit next to the Caboolture Police Station in King Street on what has been a vacant block for the past six years. Once completed, it will replace the existing PCYC Caboolture facility (currently located on Toovey Street) as a safe space to connect youth who are at-risk or disadvantaged with local police in a positive environment.

Its purpose-built dedicated youth spaces, basketball court and other recreational areas will enable PCYC to expand its programs in the community. The new club will also cater for a range of community activities, events, group fitness and gym classes, gymnastics, boxing and basketball, with accessibility and inclusivity at the forefront of its design.

The project has the support of all three levels of government, with \$10 million from the federal government, \$5 million from the Queensland government and \$2.5 million from the City of Moreton Bay.

State member for Morayfield and Queensland Police and Community Safety Minister Mark Ryan has been a strong advocate for this project and said he was pleased to see it taking shape.

"I made an election commitment to my local community to make this important project a reality and it is extremely gratifying to see that with Commonwealth support we have reached this milestone," Mr Ryan said. "This project will help

QPCYC deliver more youth development and crime prevention programs, in turn, building agency and engagement in our young people."

City of Moreton Bay Mayor Peter Flannery highlighted the importance that a new facility will bring to those who are set to benefit from it.

"PCYC plays a vital role in building strong community connections for youth in the Caboolture area, providing a linkage to sport and recreation and a place to engage and build relationships," Mr Flannery said. "I'm proud that Council was able to work with all levels of government and QPCYC to move on this and give the youth of Caboolture this much-needed upgrade."

For more than 75 years, PCYC Queensland has been providing young people across the state with an environment that supports individual development, encourages community connection and celebrates diversity.

"This new facility will give PCYC Queensland the opportunity to deliver more programs that build safer, healthier communities through youth development in the City of Moreton Bay," PCYC CEO Phil Schultz said.

"We encourage young people to thrive with purpose, focus, skills and opportunity through our prevention, intervention and diversionary programs. These programs not only provide practical pathways to employment and re-engagement, they promote respect and leadership in everyday life."

The new PCYC Caboolture facility is expected to be completed in mid-2025.

On 28 August, all children under the age of 14 can compete in the Moreton Island Classic. Finally, on 7 September there's the School Children Junior Competition at Tangalooma.



JILL'S

INGREDIENTS

1lb (16oz) sausage meat

1lb (16oz) minced steak

1 cup soft breadcrumbs

2 onions (finely chopped)

2 teaspoons curry powder

1 egg

1/2 cup milk

1/2 cup water

salt, pepper

1/4 cup parsley (finely chopped, more if required)

METHOD

Combine all ingredients for the meatloaf and form into shape in a greased loaf tin. Bake in a 180-degree oven for 30 minutes.

Pour off the excess liquid in the loaf tin.

Sauce: In a pot combine all sauce ingredients and bring slowly to the boil, pour over the meatloaf and cook for a further 30-35 minutes.

Notes: You can half the ingredients to make one loaf. Also, double the sauce if a little more is required.

(I like more sauce so I do double the sauce recipe).

Serves 6

SAUCE

1/2 cup water

1/4 cup brown sugar

1 oz butter

1/4 cup Worcester sauce

1/2 cup tomato sauce

1 teaspoon instant coffee powder

2 tablespoons lemon juice

- A more affordable entry point: The median house price in Australia's capital cities is now \$975,592. Compare that to the median unit price of \$669,434 and that's a big difference at the checkout. With apartments generally being more affordable than houses, it means you'll need to save up less of a deposit, and you may find servicing the loan on an apartment easier too.
- Fewer maintenance responsibilities: When you own a house, you must foot the bill for all the repairs and maintenance. With an apartment or unit, the costs of any repairs or maintenance in common areas are split with other unit owners, usually through a body corporate scheme.
