


hat's better than seeing an old-school Landcruiser out on the road? How about the largest gathering of classic Toyota Landcruisers in one place?!

# THE STORY OF THE WAMURAI TENNIS CLUB

he history of the Wamuran Tennis Club is a story of community spirit, competition and resilience. Founded on 15 December 1921 under the leadership of Mr George Salisbury, the club quickly became a cornerstone of the Wamuran community.

Salisbury, serving as the inaugural president of the Albert Tennis Club, sought to establish a tennis court on the local Albert Hall grounds. The Progress Association granted their request and the club was officially born, with members committing to cover any damages and protect the hall's windows with netting.

The club thrived during the 1920s and 1940s, despite the small size of the Wamuran community. During these decades, tennis enthusiasts also played on private courts at Bracalba and the Moles' property in Wamuran Basin.

The club's growth was mirrored by the involvement of numerous families, including the Jensens, Whittings and Bells, who were integral in the early Hall Committee. Tennis wasn't just a game; it was a social lifeline that connected residents through both competition and camaraderie.

The post-war era saw the Wamuran Tennis Club expand its reach and capabilities. In July 1950, the Hall Committee granted permission to install lights on the courts, enabling night fixtures. This period marked the club's affiliation with the Caboolture Tennis Association, with Saturday afternoon matches drawing in competitors from neighbouring clubs like Glasshouse, Elimbah and Bribie.

However, the club faced challenges. The original lights, installed in 1950, were declared unsafe in 1973, leading to their removal. By 1980, new lights were installed, reigniting the club's evening fixtures. Despite the advent of Saturday trading in 1984 and a subsequent decline in player numbers, the club remained active. In 1990, the Wamuran Tennis Club boasted 64 members.

As the 1990s progressed, the rise of alternative sports and increased work commitments led to the decline of Saturday afternoon fixtures, eventually ceasing by the late 1990s. Wamuran Tennis Club was incorporated in 1994 but struggled with dwindling interest. On 12 January 2003, the club was officially wound up, and its remaining funds were donated to the Wamuran Sportsground Committee.

Today, the legacy of the Wamuran Tennis Club is remembered not just as a sports organisation but as a vital part of Wamuran's social fabric, reflecting the enduring community spirit that defined its nearly 82 years of existence.





# The INS and OUTS OF THE WARABA PDA

STORY SHEREE HODDINETT

s Queensland's newest Priority Development Area (PDA), Waraba represents a forwardthinking approach to urban development.

The Waraba PDA was declared on 2 August and includes about 2,900 hectares of land. It is bounded by the existing and emerging suburban areas of Bellmere, Lilywood and Wagtail Grove to the east, the D'Aguilar Highway to the north, Caboolture River Road to the south and the low hills along Old North Road to the west. It is identified as a major expansion growth area in Shaping SEQ 2023.

This designation by Economic Development Queensland (EDQ) positions Waraba as a key focus for future growth and development, designed to meet the increasing housing demands while promoting sustainable community development.

Why has the Queensland government declared the Waraba PDA?

- Waraba is one of four major expansion areas identified for growth in earlier state planning for the metro sub-region of SEQ. To realise the ultimate development vision for Waraba, the scope and cost of the infrastructure for the area need to be understood and confirmed.
- The government has declared the Waraba PDA to use the powers and functions of the Minister for Economic Development Queensland (MEDQ) under the Economic Development Act 2012 to remove uncertainty about land use outcomes, infrastructure requirements and infrastructure charges for the whole of Waraba and to facilitate the delivery of this significant future housing supply in the Moreton Bay region.

The Waraba PDA is envisaged to ultimately:

 provide diverse housing, including social and affordable options, of about 30,000 dwellings for about 70,000 people;

- facilitate the development of employmentrelated land uses, including retail and commercial activity centres, industrial activities and mixed industry/business uses, to meet the broader land use demands of the Moreton Bay Local Government Area; and
- deliver a broad range of civil, civic and community infrastructure and services required to support the future community.

City of Moreton Bay has welcomed the declaration of Waraba as Queensland's newest PDA.


Mayor Peter Flannery said the assurance that City of Moreton Bay will retain authority for development assessment was important to ensure Council's commitment to housing diversity and liveability was prioritised in Waraba.

"We're planning a new city of 30,000 dwellings and an expected population of 70,000 people, so it is important we get this right," Mr Flannery said. "We're calling on a commitment from the state government to stump up the funding and hurry up with the delivery of critical infrastructure, so this future community can reach its full potential.

"We want to ensure the development of Waraba, and growth of City of Moreton Bay, does not come at a cost to current residents or the environment, so we will continue to put an emphasis on the need for robust planning and advocate for critical infrastructure upgrades."

### 5 COMMON REASONS "PRE-APPROVED" HOME LOAN **APPLICATIONS ARE REJECTED**

pplying for a home loan can be exciting yet stressful and receiving a pre-approval feels like you're one step closer to your dream home. However, a pre-approval isn't a guarantee of final approval, and there are several reasons why a lender might reject your application. Here are five common reasons and what to do if it happens.

### 1. Changes in Your Financial Situation

Any significant change in your financial situation could impact your home loan application. If you've lost your job, seen a reduction in income, or switched jobs since being preapproved, lenders may view you as a higher risk. They want

to ensure you can comfortably repay the loan. To avoid this, aim for financial stability between pre-approval and applying for the loan.

### 2. Deterioration in Your Credit Score

Your credit score plays a crucial role in a lender's decision. If you've taken on new debt or missed payments on existing loans, your credit score may drop, which could lead to a rejection. Managing your existing debts carefully and avoiding additional credit applications after preapproval will help protect your score.

### 3. Changes in Lending Criteria

Sometimes lenders change their lending criteria after issuing pre-approval. Tightened requirements might make you ineligible for a loan. Additionally, pre-approval errors—such as incomplete or incorrectly verified information could also cause problems later. Ensure all your documents are accurate and up-to-date to minimise the risk.

### 4. Lender Concerns About the Property

### hat were you doing when you were 15 years old?

Amongst the dignitaries at the recent reopening ceremony of the new Burpengary Railway Station sat a woman whose memories of working at the station stretch back further than those of anyone else in attendance.

Local grandmother, Shirley Lane (nee Mussig), now a vibrant 83-year-old, was given the job of station mistress at Burpengary Station in 1957. Shirley was only 15 years and six weeks of age

at the time, making her the youngest station mistress in Queensland and possibly in Australia.

Shirley said much had changed since her railway days.

"The building back then was very primitive and it wasn't only a railway station," Shirley said. "It was also the post office, the telephone exchange and an agency for the Commonwealth Bank.

"The station was staffed from 6am to 10pm. Two of us worked there – you would work either 6am to 2pm or 2pm to 10pm. We didn't sit around waiting for trains. We also sorted the mail and gave it to the postman.

"In 1962, I applied for annual leave as I was getting married. Queensland Rail promptly told me that they don't employ married women and I had to retire.

"They must have had trouble finding someone a few years later though as I did relief work when I was pregnant with my third child."

The building itself has come a long way, too. In 1888, the first 'crossing gate' was built and the prefabricated station building was completed in 1917. Historical records of world events were left

in the ceiling of the building by the Queensland Rail workers who constructed it. This 'time capsule' of sorts was not uncovered until the 1990s.

Shirley said the funniest memory she had of her time at Burpengary was of those crossing gates.

"They were big heavy gates and I had to manually operate them to let a herd of about 60 cattle cross the lines without wandering down the tracks," she said. "It wasn't

something you saw every day and I've never forgotten it."

Special thanks to Shirley for sharing her memories with us – she is a living legend.



Rodney said he was an advocate with a longstanding interest in politics, who promised to fight for his community's voice. He said he was determined to address pressing issues such as crime, drug use and youth unemployment.

"I'm passionate about Morayfield and I've dedicated my career to delivering for our community," Mr Hansen said.

He said the Greens had plans for public and affordable housing and services that the community needed, such as free childcare and properly funded schools and hospitals.

"I have always been sceptical of politics and held the belief that politicians operated in their own interests, so I thought it was time to make a change and give people the option to vote for someone who will work for them," he said.

**Suniti Hewett** will be running as the candidate for the Family First Party. Suniti said she believed strong families, freedom for faith and protecting the most vulnerable were critical for the future of the community and the state. She said protecting children from inappropriate sexual and gender indoctrination and shielding families from rising power bills due to renewables were the top campaign priorities for the Family First Party.
